Dear Parents and Carers

We have just one week to go, but there are still many more activities to end the festive season in school. The remaining dates and times are all published in this newsletter.

Lower School Nativity: What a treat we had this week to see all of the lower school children perform on stage for 'Hey Ewe!' The atmosphere in the hall was buzzing as parents, grandparents and friends waited with anticipation to see the delights of the singing, dancing and acting. The Year 2 children led the performances, with each class taking it in turn to act or sing. Year 1, Bee and Ladybird classes had their moments too and it was lovely to see these very young children enjoying the moment and coping so well in a large hall with bright lights and an audience of many faces. If you were able to watch the performance, I am sure you will have laughed, shed a tear and admired the courage of all the children. Well done everyone and to all of the staff for making this happen, it was another heart- warming moment.

Christmas Dinner Extravaganza: Our catering service is going extremely well. Our lunchtime supervisors and cooks work tirelessly for our children and we are very grateful for their hard work and care.

'Choir on Tour': Today the choir went on their annual tour to the RUH and local care homes and I felt very proud to be associated with such talented and enthusiastic pupils. Whilst watching at the RUH members of the public spoke to me and said how impressed they were at the standard of singing and confidence of the children. The choir will have touched many hearts; thank you for giving something so special back to our Newbridge community.

More Christmas events: Next week you are invited to join the Nativity service at Emmanuel Church on Wednesday 19th December. The lower school children all take part in this this simple and beautiful performance, which will be led by the Year 2 children.

If you only have children in the lower school, you may be unaware of the Christmas Concert that takes place in the upper school. These concerts are an opportunity for all of the children who learn musical instruments, who play in musical groups and who are members of the choir, to show-off their talents. There are two concerts and the one on Thursday 20th December at 10am usually has seats available. Even If your child is not performing at the concert, you are most welcome to attend. Defibrillators in school: You may not know that we have two defibrillators on the school site that anyone could access in an emergency situation. With such a large community and with so many events, it is important that you know where to find them. They are each placed in the school medical rooms – one in the lower school, off of the hall and one in the upper school, off of the main corridor. You do not need to have training to use them – when accessed the images and recorded instructions will tell you what to do.


Arriving late for school: I have noticed that an increasing number of families have been arriving late for school in the morning. The lower school children have to be in their classrooms by 8.50am and the upper school children have to be in their classrooms by 8.55am. When a child is not on time and has to join the class after it has started, it can make the child feel uncomfortable. Late arrivals also put a strain on the office staff as children need to be taken to class and school meal information has not been collected. Mrs Hansard oversees attendance and punctuality and is issuing letters to parents and carers when lateness and absence is persistent.

Charges for late pick-up from After School Club and extra-curricular clubs: The school policy is that parents and carers will be charged additionally if children are not collected by the end of After School Club. From 6.00pm, parents will be charged £10.00 for any period to 6.30pm and a subsequent £10.00 for any half hour period thereafter. Please note that this is **not an extension** to After School Club hours, this is so that the school does not incur additional staffing costs when parents are late. If children are not collected from clubs after school on time and following ten minutes of waiting, the club leader/staff member will send the child to the After School Club and parents/carers will be charged for the After School Club at the rate of £11.00. Please help our staff and club leaders by being on time.

We could not do our job without you and we are very grateful for all you do. Please do come along if you can.

Above is Emilia W from 3KC and her amazing homemade Advent Calendar. Emilia's favourite door was number 3 because this is her birthday!




